On Results Day, I will go to my school to collect my results, or I will follow the instructions given by my school to get my results.



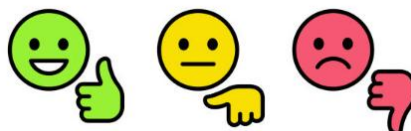
I may see my teachers, classmates, or other staff.

I can wait to open the envelope in private with my parent/carer or I can open them in school.

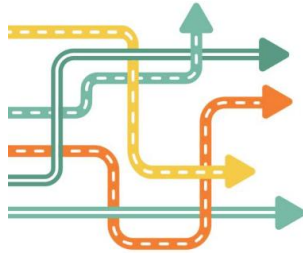
Some people will be happy; others might be upset. Everyone reacts differently.
